HEBREWS 1. 1-14

ADVENT 3 - The Angels ADORE



We know that Christmas is near when we talk about angels and sing angelic carols, (which is what we will be doing this week).

We should talk about angels more often because they get so many mentions in the Bible. St Peter is mentioned in the Bible 178 times, which is more than all the gospel writers, St Paul, the Virgin Mary and John the Baptist put together, but angels are mentioned 273 times! So perhaps angels, who they are and what they do, deserve more study.

The word angel comes from a Greek word 'angelos' that literally means 'messenger' and the Bible angels are the messengers of God. The Bible also tells us that angels are not alike: the Seraphim have six wings, and the Cherubim have two wings. Some are senior angels like the archangels, and some have very specific tasks like the four living creatures (Revelation 4:6), angels who continually worship around the throne of God.

In art, angels are depicted as being a bit feminine or like chubby infants, but in the Bible, they are quite terrifying, and some are fearsome warriors and protectors with unsheathed swords and ringed with fire. We see this in Genesis 3:24 where the cherubim stand with a flaming, turning sword to guard the garden of Eden against anyone who might want to try getting back in after Adam and Eve's expulsion.

Some angels have no wings and look like humans. Hebrews 13:2 "...show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it."

Angels appear at Jesus' birth, and after He was tempted in the desert, and at His resurrection. When Jesus had ascended, two angels appeared to the disciples. Angels break people out of prisons, they point people in the right direction, and they appear in people's dreams, but most of the time they are invisible to us.

Angels are amazing, but the writer to the Hebrews sets out to show that Jesus is greater still. Verses 5 to 13 have been lifted, word for word, from other parts of the Bible, as if to say, 'look at what the Scriptures say about Jesus!'

In Isaiah 6 we are given a picture of the Seraphim angels calling out and encouraging one another: 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of His glory' like chanting at a football match, their voices reverberating around the throne of God. And directly around the throne are the four living creatures who since the beginning of creation

have worshipped God. Then in Revelation 5, the four living creatures fall down and worship Jesus, the Lamb of God.

Rev 5: 13, 'To the one seated on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honour and glory and might for ever and ever.' Amen!

So, as we celebrate Christmas, let's join the angels in praise, worship and adoration of Jesus our God.
