



LUKE 24. 1 -12

EASTER SUNDAY- He is not here



Have you ever arranged to see a friend and they do not show up? These days with mobile phones, it should be less likely, but people have phones on silent, dead batteries, weak signal or just don't pick up. How does it feel? There may be frustration and annoyance. You may worry that something has happened to them. Or you may just be reconciled to the fact that this is who they are. One thing is for

sure, whoever it is, is not here!

Now imagine how the women heading to the tomb early in the morning felt. They went with deep sadness, but resolved to do what they could not do on the Friday before the Sabbath - anoint the body of Jesus properly. Then: shock! The stone was rolled away. They were perplexed. Surely this is the right tomb? Then 2 men in dazzling clothes before them saying: "He is not here." The women think: "Of course He is. We saw Him die and His body placed in this tomb. This is a graveyard. His body has to be here!"

"He has risen". Don't be silly. That does not happen. "Remember his words from Galilee." Which words? He spoke so many. Oh, the ones about being handed over to sinners, being crucified and on the third day rise again. Yes. Twice before we left Galilee, Jesus said this (see Luke 9. 21-22 and 43-45). And today is the third day. Has he really risen? If so, where is He? Not in the graveyard for sure. "Don't look for the living among the dead."

Knowing the story so well, it's hard for us to imagine what it was like for those who first experienced the resurrection; to begin to realise that "He is not here. He has risen." These women had an appointment with a dead body. They certainly were not expecting a no-show! From our perspective now, "He is not here. He has risen" means for us:

- Death is defeated
- Eternal life is ours
- New life can be experienced right now
- All that was said about what happened through the cross can be trusted. We are forgiven. We are free from guilt and sin. We have an open and restored relationship with God.

When the women returned to the 11 disciples, they did not believe them. We can appreciate why. I imagine "He is risen indeed. Alleluia!" was far from their thoughts and lips, but knowing what we know now, let those Alleluias flow freely today!
